

Highbarns Chalk Mines

Emergency Advice for Householders

Introduction

A geological survey focused on a relatively limited area around the junction of Pond Road, Highbarns and East Green has revealed evidence of old chalk workings. This ground investigation work followed a partial ground collapse in a garden (now established to have been caused by a shaft collapse) in June 2007.

The chalk mines that have been discovered are located around the road junction of Highbarns, Pond Road and East Green.

The area that we have investigated so far extends 50 metres around the point where we believe the access shaft was.

Dacorum Borough Council has been co-ordinating work to apply for funding to carry out further geological surveys around the area with a view to establishing the full extent of the mine and establishing a way forward.

Your safety

Chalk mines have been around for a long period of time without affecting the safety of buildings built on or near them. Nevertheless Dacorum Borough Council's building control officers are continuing to carry out visual checks of properties in the area.

To help us in this work please make sure that you let us know as soon as possible if you notice any evidence of movements of the ground or buildings on your property or anywhere else within the vicinity of Pond Road, Highbarns or East Green.

Things you should report might include:

- Holes, depressions or areas of cracking developing in gardens or roads
- Cracks developing on buildings
- Walls beginning to lean or floors tilt
- Windows or doors becoming stuck for no obvious reason
- Sudden damage to buried services pipes such as drains, gas or water mains

If you own your home or rent it privately please call Dacorum Borough Council as soon as possible if you notice any signs of movement with your property.
